VI. Teacher/Guest Comments

The Hairy Ant Presentation: Anthony Harrison presented options to convert Wredling Wear to an online store selling directly to families and having very limited inventory as samples.

- Wredling Wear will convert to an online store, orders will be delivered to the school individually bagged and labeled sorted by grade.
- Orders need a minimum of 12 per imprint, but can vary the type/color of the item.
- Most orders (excluding bennies) can be delivered within 5-7 days.
- There will be a committee chair responsible for working directly with Hairy Ant.
- The PTO can decide what they want to mark up for fundraising, but Hairy Ant recommends keeping it minimum.
- They can offer youth sizes when the imprint is appropriate. (not oversized for the item)
- Dates for the 5th grade Clap-out will be April 20 – May 4th. Mr. Loversky will e-mail the Elementary school Principals when to expect the shirts to arrive to be distributed to students. Tim has the capability to send the link to the store to all 5th grade families.
